Dr. Satlin received his M.D. from the University of Virginia and completed residency training in Internal Medicine and fellowship training in Infectious Diseases at Weill Cornell Medical College. He also received a Master's Degree in Clinical and Translational Investigation at Weill Cornell.

He is Clinical Director of the Transplantation-Oncology Infectious Diseases Program at Weill Cornell and provides infectious diseases supportive care to immunocompromised hosts. Dr. Satlin's research interests are in the epidemiology, diagnosis, and treatment of multidrug-resistant Gramnegative bacterial infections in immunocompromised hosts, and his research is supported by grants from NIAID and industry. He is Co-Chair of the Breakpoint Working Group of the Clinical and Laboratory Standards Institute's Subcommittee on Antimicrobial Susceptibility Testing and participates on multiple committees of NIAID's Antibacterial Research Leadership Group. He also serves as Associate Editor for *Journal of Antimicrobial Chemotherapy-Antimicrobial Resistance* and on the Editorial Advisory Boards of *Clinical Infectious Diseases* and *Open Forum Infectious Diseases*.
